Hello Brethren,

It is an exciting time in our lodge. We have many upcoming events for the holiday season and several degrees to confer. The officers are making many changes to



enhance the atmosphere in the lodge. The incoming Worshipful Master has made a sound plan for 2022, including many events geared toward to lodge members and families. We have planned Ladies Night in February, events planned for Brothers' Nights Out, table lodge and plenty of family events.

Additionally, we have formed a membership committee to reach out to our brethren. In the coming year each of you should be receiving either a letter or phone call from this committee. In addition to these items for candidates, we also need help with the special events. For example, we can always use extra hands with the monthly breakfast.

We are continuing to have our practices on 2nd and 4th Tuesdays, excluding any specials for degrees called by the Master. This is an excellent time to visit and get back lodge. Our goal during practice is to focus on the details of the degrees and most of all to have FUN.



Trustee Corner

The big news from the Trustees this quarter is the replacement of our 40 year old roof. This comes at the end of lengthy negotiations with our insurance company to address wind damage and missing shingles observed over the last year. We are hopeful that insurance will reduce the lodge's outlay of cash for this roof replacement by about 50%. The ultimate result will be a longer life and higher quality roof which meets current code and will serve our lodge many years into the future. We are hopeful this roof replacement project will be completed before our annual meeting on November 2, 2021.

As we prepare for our new Masonic year, we would like to close out the Doors and Floors project by collecting the \$50 donations we need to complete our donor plaque which will be located in our lodge room to memorialize the contributions of our members to improve the physical appearance of our facilities.

As we head into the holiday season, remember our daily rental rate is \$50 for lodge members and members of our lessees. Details on how to arrange daily rentals for any family or community event can be found elsewhere in this issue of the Trestleboard.

We want to remind our members that the lodge is not a depository for personal items, nor should items be lent to the lodge with the expectation that they will be returned if they are no longer needed. It is not possible for the Trustees to keep track of such items and assure they don't get mixed in with assets that were purchased or donated for the lodge's use.
