Hello Brethren,

Trustees Corner

As we head into a new Masonic year, the Trustees want all our brethren to feel welcomed in our building and pray they will treat it respectfully and demonstrate a strong sense of stewardship. We also look forward to inviting our new members into our current culture and encouraging them to exercise their leadership qualities by example. This will enable our lodge to continue to be relevant to the Reynoldsburg community and to increase membership in Freemasonry.

At our annual meeting in November, Brother Christopher Baer was re-elected to a 3-year term as Trustee, with his term expiring in November 2025. The lodge benefits significantly from his legal expertise as a practicing attorney and his efforts in overseeing the replacement of our roof in late 2021. His efforts were instrumental in saving the lodge a considerable amount of money.

Regular maintenance was performed in December on our six fire extinguishers and our two furnaces. As we head into the cold season, remember our building is vacant for much longer than it is occupied. If you are the last brother or group of brothers to leave the building after a stated meeting or a practice, please be sure the following checklist is completed. Don't assume that someone else took care of it. Copies of this checklist are posted throughout the building, especially near the doors. We lose track of how many times one of the trustees comes back to the building the day after a practice to discover ceiling fans running or doors unlocked or open between different portions of the building.

While the furnaces are operating, thermostats must be reset to 55 degrees, the fans set to automatic, and the window blinds closed when leaving the building. This will ensure that the kitchen refrigerator and freezer are not overworked, and we won't purchase electricity we don't need.

Our daily rental rate is \$50 for lodge members and members of our lessees. Details on how to arrange daily rentals for any family or community event can be found elsewhere in this issue of the Trestleboard.

We want to remind our members that the lodge is not a repository for personal items, nor should items be lent to the lodge with the expectation that they will be returned if they are no longer needed. It is not possible for the Trustees to keep track of such items and assure they don't get mixed in with assets that were purchased or donated for the lodge's use.

As always, we remain in service to the Great Architect of the Universe, our brothers, and their families.



Education Corner RWB Ken Cohen, PM

On or about December 20 of each year, (the first day of Winter), we experience the shortest amount of daylight of any day in the year. The sun rises at its latest and sets at its earliest. Many years it barely matters, as it is often overcast and the sun can't even be seen for weeks.



This phenomenon occurs because the Earth is tilted with respect to the sun. As the Earth moves about the sun, the sun seemingly is directly overhead at a different point depending on the date. The winter solstice occurs in the northern hemisphere when the sun is directly overhead at its farthest point south.

Ok, thanks for the reminder of 8th grade science, but what does this have to do with Freemasonry?

In the Entered Apprentice degree, we learn that our lodges are dedicated to the HSJs. In fact, when the Grand Lodge of London (precursor to the United Grand Lodge of England - UGLE) was founded over 300 years ago, one of the stated reasons for forming a grand lodge was to celebrate the Masonic holidays, namely the feasts of the HSJs. The Baptist's feast day in June 24 and the Evangelist's feast day is December 27.

December 27 is awfully close to the solstice discussed above. Again, what's the connection?

Freemasonry is about the search for enlightenment or finding the light we most desire. In the summer, we celebrate the maximum amount of light we receive, but even in the darkest day of the winter, as Freemasons, we celebrate not that we are in darkness, but that every day for the next six months, every day will bring more light. So don't despair of the darkness. Come to lodge and enjoy the light.
